What we want for all children and young people



We want all children and young people up to 25 years old in West Sussex to:



have the chance to learn all they can



 feel included and be full members of their local community



• be healthy and safe



be ready for life as adults.



Children and young people and their families will:

 be supported to take part in local learning



feel welcome, included and that they belong



 feel cared for and supported in their health and keeping well



• feel valued and be included in making decisions.

Our SEND plans



Our plans have been made together with a wide group of people involved including:

parent carers



young people



 education services including schools, colleges and early years



other staff from social care, health and education.



They have used what we found out from our talks with people, information, old plans and inspections.



We have tried to make sure they fit together with our other plans.

The most important things to do



We have made a list of the most important things to do.

1. Knowing children and families well



Children and young people and their families will:

find out what they need as early as possible



feel they belong and are wanted



 feel they are involved and included in planning what they need, including when they are moving to new services



 understand and feel the service being offered is right for them. This is called the SEND Offer.



2. Children and young people having the education services they need (the SEND Offer)

You will have the right support at the right time.



We will have staff who:

know what they are doing



do their jobs well



 meet the needs of children and young people.



A choice of places to go for education that:

are very good



celebrate the good things that happen



 will tell others about things that work well.

3. Working together



Everyone who supports children and young people will:

 find the services and systems to support them to get the information they need



 think of different ways to meet the needs of SEND children and young people



 have ways of checking that we have very good SEND services



 use good information and what we know to plan together to meet the needs of children and young people.

What will we do?



We will:


 give training and use other ways to make sure children and young people are included more



 have a guide that helps places find out what children need and meet them as early as possible



 help places know when and how to get more expert support



 have a guide for families explaining the local offer for children and young people with SEND in West Sussex



 make sure everyone understands about our plans for all children and what these mean for how we work with them in schools and colleges



 give support to work in the best ways we know to do all these things



 have an event each year that looks at the best ways of including people



 make a guide about how to move to new services



check how well services are doing



 check and make special services better in all areas in West Sussex



 help services work well together by sharing information



 work together with other services to find out and support the needs of children and young people.

How will we know if we are making a difference?



We will make action plans and have ways of checking how good we are doing. These will be accessible.

We will have a group called a SEND and Inclusion strategy board checking on how well we are doing.



The board will include parent carers.



We will also have meetings with children and young people so they are involved.
